PARA-MODERNISM Life Reform Movements from 1900 Onwards 11 April to 10 August 2025

Freedom! Shaking off the constraints of bourgeois life, capitalism and industrial society. This was the dream of a great many young people around 1900 – and they set about making it come true. Some of them embarked on a new life in reform colonies far away from urban areas. In addition to the famous colony on Monte Verità, where Hermann Hesse, Käthe Kruse, Mary Wigman and many others spent formative periods, it is the Loheland women's settlement near Fulda, which was founded in 1919 and became an early emancipatory reform project. The desire for a peaceful existence in harmony with nature was at the heart of these ambitions, as were new ideas about health, physical culture and spirituality – a new attitude to life that went on to find expression in a new aesthetic.

Para-Modernism. Life Reform Movements From 1900 Onwards follows the ideals of the early life reform movement through the 20th century. Examples of the various reform movements from the fields of art, design and everyday culture are presented in eight chapters. The exhibition illustrates early approaches that paved the way for present-day thinking on sustainability and the common good. Furthermore, trends propagating the idealization of the healthy body and nationalist doctrines of salvation are highlighted.

In the exhibition, Gustav Klimt's *Nuda Veritas* (1899) will form a central starting point to illustrate the link between art and world view. The Vienna Secession, founded in 1897, and its first president Gustav Klimt formulated the claim to free art from academic captivity. Their art was an expression of an emancipatory idea that underpinned Art Nouveau and its related movements throughout Europe.

In addition, individual protagonists and their views are highlighted, who propagated an idealization of the healthy body and völkisch doctrines of salvation, which paved the way for eugenics, anti-Semitism and racism.

The exhibition is the first to look not only at the developments in Europe but also at the links to American counter-culture and the flower power movement.
